

Love

In February everybody's thinking about *love*. There are reminders all over the place that Valentine's Day is just around the corner. The seasonal aisle in the stores have red and pink hearts, chocolates, balloons, flowers, and anything else they can think to stock that says, "I love you." All the TV commercials mention it in some way. There's just no getting around it this time of year. There's a reason that in college all of my single friends and myself used to call Valentine's Day, Singles Awareness Day. When you have someone special in your life this is a beautiful and wonderful time of year, but when you're alone all of the attention society puts on love is like salt in a fresh wound.

We've probably all heard this sermon before, but it bears repeating, especially this time of year. The Greeks had three different words for love. The first is *storge*, it's loving because you have to. The love you have for your parents, your siblings; it's this loyalty that you instinctively have. It's not necessarily because you have to, but it's a love born out of loyalty. It's what parents are talking about when they say, "I don't care if you like your sister or not, you're going to love her anyway!"

Then there was eros. This is sexual love. Sensual, impulsive, spontaneous, love. It's the husband/wife passionate, "I want to kiss you right now" kind of love. Unfortunately, this is what most people in our culture envision when they say the word love and it frequently gets in the way of people trying to express other kinds of love. Rather than being misunderstood to mean something erotic people will just not express their love.

The third word they used was phileo. This is the best friend kind of love. Philadelphia, the city of brotherly love gets its name from this word. It's loving someone like they were your brother. You don't love them out of some loyalty you have together, but because they are your friend and you are that close.

But where does the love Jesus talked about fit in this system? Jesus talked about loving your enemies, loving those who persecute you, those beneath you, and those who can't love you back like widows and orphans. The Love Jesus spoke of doesn't fit into a system where you love because you must, because you're attracted to them, or because you like them. So Christians took a lackluster, really non-descript word, and applied it to Jesus' type of love and said this is agape.

In John 15 Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." Jesus' love isn't the "love because you have to", or "because you're attracted to them", or "because they're your buddy;" it's just because. He would later prove those words by laying down his own life for ours. Then, in that same passage, Jesus says to love each other as he loved us, and that's hard. It's easy to love people out of loyalty, it's easy to love someone that's pretty, and it's easy to love people that we like. However, it's hard to love people who are mean to us. It's hard to love the annoying, and the smelly. When I look into the empty tomb and realize that Jesus gave his life for me not because he had to, not because I earned it, or even because I'm so very pretty, but just because, I realize that all those other types of love are insufficient, as are my responses to people I'd rather not love.

On Valentine's Day people like to emphasize the eros type of love. However, if you're single, dating, engaged, married, divorced, widowed, or something else, you are loved more than you can possibly imagine. You are loved for who you are. You are loved because of who you are. And yes, you are loved, at times, in spite of who you are. But you have a Father in heaven who loves you. Maybe if we focused more on that this February we might all have a happy Valentine's Day and we might be able to show other people that they are loved as well.


