How's You're A.I.M.?

Last month this article dealt with which version of the bible should you be reading. This month I would like to address a slightly different question; *How* should we be reading our bibles? Now, at first this question might not make a lot of sense. "What do you mean how should we read the bible? You read it like you would any book, you just read it." And normally this person would be right, except the Bible isn't like just any other book. It is unique in all literature as the inspired word of God. It is the sole, or at least primary, authority on some very important topics such as; what should we believe about God, how should we live our lives, what is right and wrong, how should we love one another. The Bible is a living word (act of communication) from God to his people through his people. I think this book needs to be read differently than the sports page of the Sunday paper!

So what is it exactly that we are trying to do when we open up our bibles and read? If you believe what was said above, that the bible is an act of communication from God, then what you should be trying to do is discern the will of God. We want to hear the voice of God. But the very nature of the Bible effects how we must go about this. You see, God didn't carve these words on a mountainside for us to discover, or drop a completed copy of it in someone's lap 2,000 years ago. No, he inspired His people to communicate His message to us through a book, through the written word. When we read the bible we need to take into account that God is speaking to us, but he chose to do it through human words. Therefore, our goal is two-fold; first, to discern the will of God, and second, to discover the author's intended meaning.

Let's think about communication in general for a moment. There are three pieces of every communication. An author, the one communicating; a medium, a spoken word, smoke signals, Morse code, sign language, or in our case a written text; and a reader. If the goal is to understand the communication, the question is, who gets to determine the meaning? If my wife sends me to the store to get supplies for a 4th of July cookout and writes a list for me to get buns, patties, and condiments, but I come back with a loaf of bread and a bag of peppermint patties she's going to be upset with me. Even though I thought myself clever for checking patties and mints off the list with one purchase she is going to say that isn't what she meant. We don't get to hear, read, or see a communication from a person and ascribe to it any meaning we want. We don't get to determine the meaning or put a meaning into a text. This is called eisegesis (pronounced ice-a-Jesus), it means to put meaning into the text. This makes for really bad communication. We need to practice exegesis (taking meaning out of the text) and search for the meaning the author intended to convey. This is especially true when dealing with such an important document as the Bible. Our goal is to discover what the human author of the text was trying to convey to his readers. In bible college we called this the A.I.M. of bible study. Author's Intended Meaning, A.I.M.

This is not separate from hearing God; this is *how* we hear God. God inspired the bible to be written by human authors. Therefore, when we understand their meaning we understand what God inspired. We can't bypass the human author to get to the Divine author because that's not the way God chose to convey the information to us. When we honor the way that God wrote the Bible we are more likely to correctly interpret its meaning. Our goal is to discern God's voice by discovering the author's intended meaning. Put simply, we listen to God by understanding the text.
