Our Need for Community

A few months ago I realized that if we wanted to effectively reach people in this community with the gospel we needed to create an environment where people felt connected. With the Air Force presence in town much of our community consists of people who are being moved from place to place across the country and don't have a place that is home. For people like this, having a church family, people that care about you and your life, a place that feels like home, even if it is only for two years, is vital. The rest of our community are locals that have grown up in a small town and wouldn't have it any other way. They love this community because of its small-town feel. They love that you can bump into people you know when you're out and about, that people know your kids and what they're involved in, and that feeling that you know everybody or at least know someone who knows them. For this person, attending a church where you aren't connected, where people don't know and love you, is not an option. Period.

So if we want to succeed in reaching this town with the gospel we have to be a place where people can come and connect. Scripture tells us that this is the way that mankind is designed. When God originally created everything he would look at what he created and say, "It is good." However, there was one day that he said that something was not good. Genesis 2:18 says, "It is not good that the man should be alone." There is a primal need within all of us for companionship, for community. God as a trinity exists in community and we, created in his image, have that same need.

So, community is a basic need for humanity and a specific need for our community. Therefore, if we can be a church that provides community, a place to really connect with people our town will love us. So how do we become this kind of church? This is what I've been addressing on Sunday mornings for the past few months. In April I started by preaching through a series called creating community where we talked about how to create community with a common purpose, in your common place, and with your common possessions. And more recently I've been preaching through 2 Timothy looking at the church and how it's designed to be a community of faith.

The reason I've been beating this drum for so long is because when the church is doing what it should, it really is the answer for what our culture is craving. Paul points out in Ephesians 2 that in Christ all that once divided us and isolated us is abolished. "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God." We are members of God's household, of His family. In the church we have a good, good father, and because of his example we know how to love one another as he loved us (Jn. 13:34).

I often hear people say things like, "You don't need to go to church to be saved." While I understand what they're saying, and technically it's true, that phrase doesn't make a lot of sense when you think about it. Church is not a place to which you go. The church is a group of believers, it is the body of Christ. You wouldn't say that your hand doesn't need to go to body to be alive. That doesn't make sense. The Church is the family of God. You wouldn't say you don't need to go to family to be alive. That doesn't make sense. When you become a Christian, you become a part of a larger body, you become a member of a family. Hebrews tells us not to forsake meeting together but to encourage one another (Heb. 10:25). We gather together on Sunday mornings to be an encouragement to each other, to be there for each other, to stir up one another to love and good works (Heb. 10:24). By meeting together we give one another a place to belong.

So don't go to church, be the church. Let's be a church that connects with people so that they feel the love that Jesus showed us; so that they know they are a part of a community, a family. Let's show the isolated people of our community that they have a home.
